November is sometimes called the gray month for the cloudy sunless skies that often dominate our days. The turn from October to November was especially gloomy this year. On October 28, Paul Manz, well-known Lutheran organist and church musician, died in St. Paul, Minnesota. Manz is well known for his improvisations and for invigorating the 'hymn sing.' He composed the hymn "Peace Came to Earth" (Tune: Schneider; ELW 285) and the anthem, "E'en So, Lord Jesus, Quickly Come." On November 7, Herbert Brokering, writer of many hymn texts, died in Bloomington, Minnesota. Some of us grew up on his parables and short stories, but he also wrote many well-known and well-loved hymn texts, such as "Thine the Amen" (ELW 826) and "Earth and All Stars" (ELW 731).

We give thanks to God for the beauty and wonder of God's creation that has been revealed to us through the sharing of their gifts. May they rest in peace, and may light perpetual shine upon them.

We conclude our series of Psalter reviews with a look at *A Hymn Tune Psalter*. Published by Church Publishing, this two-volume Psalter contains the Psalms for all three years of the *Revised Common Lectionary*. Carl P. Daw and Kevin Hackett have based the antiphons for the Psalms on familiar hymns and added Psalm tones which are easy to learn and sing, yet different enough that they add interest to any cantor's repertoire of chant tones. While the copyrights are held by the composers, the publication clearly gives permission for the antiphons to be reproduced for local congregational use. If you use a Psalter which has not been included in this series of reviews and would like to share your impressions of it, please let us know. # EUCHARISTIC PRAYERS IN January and February

As you plan the liturgies of January and February, the following chart may give you some help in choosing which Eucharistic prayer to use. For December suggestions, please refer to the September *Sanctus*:

Eucharist Prayer III in the Leader's Desk Edition of *ELW* is suggested for Advent through Transfiguration, and Prayer IV is suggested for Ash Wednesday and following. Eucharistic Prayer XI works well for the Christmas season through the Baptism of our Lord, and Prayer I works well during Lent. Eucharistic Prayer B in the Leader's Edition of *WOV* is suggested for the Season of Christmas, Prayer C for the Season of Epiphany, and Prayer D for the Season of Lent.
