How you can promote these programs in your community:

This one-page flyer is available in pdf form. Copy it and share it in your faith community, neighborhood, or other community group.

Join with other faith groups to meet with the program director of your network affiliate to let him/her know that these programs would have a positive impact in the community.

All programs (except Christmas) have commercial breaks. If possible, join funds with other faith groups to offer to buy time in the program or to buy the time slot so that the station will air the program.

After your local station airs the program, let them know you appreciated it by sending a note or e-mail of thanks. Be specific, including comments from viewers in your faith group.
